






Dear Friends.

We come to the final week of our joyful Christmastide, which concludes with the great Feast of the Epiphany and, on the following Sunday, the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord. An "epiphany" is an appearance. In the readings for this Feast, with their rising stars and gleaming lights, we see the Child born on Christmas Day revealed as the promised Messiah. In the Gospel, Herod's question about the birthplace of the Messiah leads the chief priests and scribes to combine two Old Testament promises: the Messiah from the line of David, and a ruler who will shepherd His flock and whose greatness shall reach to the ends of the earth. Those promises, long made to Israel's kings, find fulfilment in the newborn King of the Jewsadored today by the Magi. These wise men, likely Persian astrologers, followed a star that fulfilled Balaam's ancient prophecy (see Numbers 24:17). Their gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh echo the pilgrimage of the Queen of Sheba and other kings who once visited King Solomon. Yet here, in Jesus, we encounter someone greater than Solomon—One who invites all peoples to share in His light and grace.

This revelation challenges us: will we welcome this Child, as the Magi did, or will we remain unmoved like the priests and scribes who missed God's living Word? Let us follow the signs to Him, keeping our eyes fixed on the brightness He brings to our world. As we enter the New Year 2025, may the Lord bless you and your loved ones with good health, peace, and joy. Let us make this a year of drawing closer to Jesus, who continually offers us His abiding presence. One of my favourite Scripture verse comes from the Prophet Isaiah: "Arise, shine, for your light has come!" (Isaiah 60:1). May we arise with fresh hope and love in our hearts as we leave Christmastide, soon entering again the rhythm of Ordinary Time in the liturgical year with deeper faith and gratitude.

Epiphany: The Twin Feast of Christmas

Saint Augustine once remarked that the Feast Epiphany also symbolises the eternal human of the Epiphany is like a twin to Christmas. In quest for goodness, truth, and light. of these Eastern visitors. The idea of there Epiphany stands at the crossroads of Scripture, history, faith, and tradition. It invites us not just to recall an ancient journey, but to undertake our own daily search for God's presence. Like the Magi, we must be willing to follow divine signs wherever they lead and, with humility, bow low before the Christ Child. No matter how festively we celebrate it, or how quietly we reflect on the miracle of God revealed to the nations, let us remember St Augustine's insight: 'three The Epiphany is truly the 'twin feast' representing of Christmas, reminding us that ٠ the Child born in Bethlehem is revealed as the light of the whole world - to you and me!

being three likely arose from the mention of three gifts: gold, frankincense, and myrrh symbolising Christ's kingship, divinity, and future suffering. Tradition eventually supplied names and even royal titles. Ultimately, the Magi's journey underscores God's universal call: both poor shepherds and wealthy sages bow before the same Saviour. No social class or background is beyond the reach of Christ's

redemption. Magi', various regions or even different races, remind us that salvation is offered to all.
