

As we journey deeper into Advent, today's Gospel invites us to stand alongside the crowds who, filled with expectation, ask John the Baptist, "What then should we do?" (Luke 3:10). John's call to repentance, rooted in the Greek word metanoia, challenges us to a radical turning away from sin and toward God. This isn't just an adjustment of attitudes but a transformative way of living—bearing good fruits in charity, honesty, and justice. This Third *Gaudete* Sunday reminds us that repentance is not born from fear but from joy. The Lord is near, and His coming is our cause for celebration. Like Mary, the Daughter of Zion, we are called to rejoice in the nearness of our Saviour. Her "yes" to God changed the world, and so can ours, if we turn our hearts fully to Him. As we prepare for Christmas, let us ask ourselves sincerely, "What should we do?" and open our hearts to the good news of His mercy.

This Advent is especially meaningful as it coincides with the beginning of the Jubilee Year 2025, a time for renewal and rediscovery of God's love and mercy. The Holy Door has been flung open in Rome and designated Jubilee churches around the world, inviting us to become *Pilgrims of Hope*. This Jubilee offers us the chance to receive a plenary indulgence, a profound expression of God's mercy, by meeting the following conditions: 1) Participation in Mass, the Liturgy of the Hours, or devout prayer, including the Rosary or Eucharistic Adoration; 2) The Sacrament of Penance and reception of Holy Communion; 3) Prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father. For those unable to participate in person due to illness, age, or confinement, indulgences can still be obtained by uniting in prayer and offering their sufferings to God.

In our own Archdiocese, several churches have been designated as Jubilee sites. These include: Cathedral of St George (Southwark), St Ann's (Kingston Hill), St Mary's (West Croydon), St Boniface (Tooting), St Elizabeth of Portugal (Richmond), Sacred Heart (Wimbledon), St Saviour's (Lewisham), Our Lady of Sorrows (Peckham), St Edmund of Canterbury (Beckenham), St Thomas More (Dulwich), St Stephen (Welling), St John Fisher (Bexley), and closer to us in Kent: St Thomas's (Canterbury), Our Lady of Hartley (Hartley), The Friars (Aylesford), St Augustine's Shrine (Ramsgate), St Jude's Shrine (Faversham). These sacred spaces invite us to pause, reflect, and draw near to God through prayer and sacramental life.

This Jubilee is a chance for all of us to ask, "What should we do?" and take concrete steps toward holiness. Whether through personal prayer, a pilgrimage, or acts of charity, let us embrace this time of grace with open hearts. May this Advent and Jubilee Year lead us, the pilgrims of hope, closer to the joy of Christ's presence in our lives and the world.
