Dear Friends,

As we continue to reflect on the joy and grace of the Induction Celebration last Wednesday, these words remind us of our shared journey in faith. Together, we are called to be active workers in the vineyard of the Lord, supporting one another in prayer and service, and living as a community united in Christ's love. In today's Gospel (Mark 10:17-30), we encounter the rich young man who seeks eternal life but struggles with letting go of his many possessions. Jesus' words challenge us to reflect on what might be holding us back from fully following Him. Is it our attachment to things and habits, our desire for comfort, or perhaps even our reluctance to step out of our familiar routines? This passage invites us to consider what it means to be truly free - to be unburdened by worldly attachments so that we can follow Christ with an undivided heart. As we reflect on this Gospel, let us ask ourselves: What do I need to let go of in order to follow Christ more fully? What does it mean for me to trust in God's wisdom and

let Him lead my life?

This Sunday is also Prison Sunday, a time for us to remember those in our society who are imprisoned and those affected by crime. As we pray for them, let us ask for God's mercy to touch their lives and bring healing. Let us also reflect on Christ's words: "I was in prison, and you visited me" (Matthew 25:36). Our prayers and actions can offer hope and comfort to those who feel forgotten, reminding them that they too are loved by God and invited to the banquet of His grace.

As we continue through this month of October, dedicated to Our Lady of the Rosary, may we draw strength from prayer and deepen our trust in God's providence. Let us turn to Mary, who always said "yes" to God's will, and ask for her intercession as we strive to live out our faith with greater commitment and love.

Prisoners' Sunday

This Sunday, 13th October, marks Prisoners' Sunday and the beginning of Prison Week (13th-19th October), a special time to focus on the needs of prisoners, their families, and all affected by imprisonment. As a parish, we are invited to reflect on how we can offer our support to those in prison and their loved ones, remembering Jesus' call, "I was in prison and you visited me" (Matthew 25:36).

Prisoners and their families often experience deep isolation, fear, and hardship. Many children are affected by the imprisonment of a parent, and families are torn apart. Meanwhile, prisoners themselves may struggle with mental health issues, loneliness, and the challenge of reintegrating into society after release.

The Catholic charity Pact (Prison Advice and Care Trust) is at the forefront of providing practical support to prisoners and their families. Their work is rooted in Catholic Social Teaching, and their mission is to offer hope, dignity, and assistance to those affected by imprisonment. Last year alone. Pact supported over 485,000 prison visits and assisted thousands of families through their helplines, emergency grants, and practical support services.
