



St Benedict of Nursia, in his Rule, emphasised that prayer should be the foundation and culmination of every Christian action. How I see the Immacul ate Conception Of the BI essed Virgin Mary...

The Blessed Virgin Mary is the undisputed central figure of Advent, with 8th December (this year, exceptionally observed on 9th December) commemorating the dogma of her Immaculate Conception. Often, this dogma is misunderstood as a privilege. The word "privilege" might bring to mind something that conveys benefits, like an award or honour. This raises a natural question: why did she receive this, and not me? When we frame it as a privilege—of the Immaculate Conception, of the Assumption, or of perpetual virginity—we risk portraying Mary as a superhuman figure, leaving us unsure of how to relate to her. One might think: isn't Jesus sufficient? He is, after all, the sole Saviour.

However, it is more accurate to view the Immaculate Conception not as a privilege but as a sign. This is well captured with the Latin term *munus*, a word that encompasses both a gift and the responsibilities that flow from it. It is something good but given for a specific purpose.

Take, for example, a couple. A young man proposes, saying, "Will you marry me?" If the answer is "yes," he becomes the happiest man in the world. But in accepting, he receives the munus of being her fiancé, and later her husband. This is a great honour, but it comes with concrete duties and lifelong consequences. In Catholic teaching, marriage is a commitment that cannot be revoked — it's a sacrament for life. Similarly, parenthood and priesthood are lifelong callings. Once given, these identities cannot be renounced. They are gifts intertwined with responsibility. The Immaculate Conception, then, is Mary's munus. As God provides each person with what they need, Mary was given the grace of the Immaculate Conception because it was necessary for her mission as the mother of Jesus. It wasn't essential for us, and that's why we weren't given it.

The essence of the mystery of the Immaculate Conception lies in the fact that Mary was preserved from all stain of original sin through the merits of Jesus Christ, foreseen from all eternity. For many, the experience of sin, especially habitual sin, might create the impression that sin is foundational to their existence. Without grace — through neglect of confession, sacraments, and prayer — someone might begin to feel that sin is their natural state, as water is for fish. The Immaculate Conception refutes this notion. St Paul writes in Ephesians that God "chose us in Christ before the foundation of the world to be holy and blameless before him" (Eph 1:3-4). When



we are overcome by doubt, the Immaculate Conception reminds us that before sin existed, each of us was in God's plan, pure and unblemished. Mary is not presented as a figure to admire from afar but as a sign of our destiny. God will purify us as He purified Mary, and this process begins now through confession and selfexamination.

Regular self-examination is essential. It is not merely a litany of sins but a tool to uncover who we truly are and where we stand in our journey. Think of it as consulting a map during a journey. Look at St. Joseph as an example. After marrying Mary, he discovered she was pregnant but didn't know how. As a young man from a small, humble village like Nazareth, Joseph faced a challenging dilemma. Out of compassion, he decided to quietly leave Mary and bear the blame himself. It was then that God revealed the mystery of Jesus's conception by the Holy Spirit. Through this trial, Joseph came to understand his true nature and calling. This leads us to the great task of self-discovery through regular selfexamination, alongside God's promise: "You will be free from evil, I promise you." To understand this longing for freedom better, we might turn to the writings of Thomas Merton (see: Conjectures of a Guilty Bystander) who described a mystical insight into the "point vierge," (or the "virgin point") the innermost centre of every person, untouched by sin, illusion, or self-awareness. It is a point of pure truth and beauty, entirely belonging to God - a place where the true essence of a person shines as God sees them. This aligns with the mystery of the Immaculate Conception, which reflects not only Mary's unique role but also the truth of every human being. While the Old Testament recounts humanity's repeated falls into sin, the Immaculate Conception marks a breakthrough: God begins a new chapter in creation by forming the New Eve — Mary, conceived without sin. This moment is both a starting point and the ultimate destination of human history.

When we say Mary is our mother, our model, and our guide, we mean that she shows us who we are in God's eyes. Everyone seeks to be free from sin and frustration, but we often take misguided paths because we fail to reflect on our conscience or consult our spiritual map.

This breathtaking mystery shows us who we truly are and the immense holiness within every person, even if it is buried beneath sin.
