As September arrives, we find ourselves in a season of new beginnings. The children are returning to school, routines are being re-established, and the summer holidays are coming to an end—at least for most of us! In line with these new beginnings, our sacramental programmes are also restarting. The second part of our Confirmation preparation will soon resume, offering our young people the opportunity to deepen their understanding of the faith and to fully embrace the commitment they are about to make. Similarly, our First Communion programme will begin, as our youngest members take their first steps toward full participation in the Eucharist. For those exploring the faith through the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA), this is a time of profound learning and growth, leading to the possibility of joining the Church at Easter.

This week's readings invite us to consider the deeper meaning of our actions and the true purpose of the law that God has given us. The Gospel, in particular, challenges us to move beyond the mere external observance of rules and rituals, urging us instead to focus on the transformation of our hearts. Jesus, guoting the prophet Isaiah, reminds us that it is possible to follow the law outwardly while missing its true intent. The law, as given to Israel, was never meant to be a checklist of "dos" and "don'ts". Rather, it was designed to shape us into a people capable of living in God's presence, reflecting His wisdom and justice to the world. The readings from Deuteronomy and the Epistle of James echo this theme, calling us to be "doers" of the Word and not just hearers. Our faith should be active, manifesting in how we treat others and live out the truths we profess.

This Weekend is an opportune time to examine our own relationship with God's law. Are we simply going through the motions, or are we allowing the Word to take root in our hearts, guiding our actions and shaping our lives? Jesus' words in the Gospel challenge us to look inward, to ensure that our faith is not just about outward appearances, but about genuine transformation and commitment to living by God's truth.

Let us use this time of new beginnings to renew our commitment to living out the Gospel in our daily lives. May we be examples of God's love and wisdom to those around us, not just in what we say, but in how we live.

Wishing you all a blessed and reflective week ahead-whether you are returning from holiday or, like me, just about to start one! Fr Peter


